## VISIT THE OLDEST HOUSE IN SASKATOON!

The oldest house in Saskatoon still standing on its original site is the Marr Residence, located at 326 11st East in Nutana. It was built by Alexander (Sandy) Marr in 1884 and was part of the original temperance settlement that started Saskatoon as a city. Since 1979 the house has been converted to a museum holding exhibits on what life was like in Saskatoon in the late 1800's, and featuring the history of the building's use as a field hospital during the Northwest Resistance of 1885. # HISTORICAL NUTANA



Saskatoon as we know it today was originally settled by a Temperance Colony in 1882. The area that was settled along the South Saskatchewan River is now known as Nutana. This neighborhood is adjacent to the Broadway district on the East river bank of our current city.

Several buildings in Saskatoon that housed influential people have been preserved over the years. Past occupants of many heritage status homes contributed to founding activities in Saskatoon and helped shape our city for what it is today. The City of Saskatoon keeps an archive of these homes and landmarks their significance throughout the city with plaques offering passers by a brief summary of each site.

## GET WALKING!



This week, our Historical Walking Tour and competition takes places in the Nutana area. Don't forget a camera or a phone with a camera to take photos for the competition, and make sure you are wearing proper shoes and clothing.

- Start at Graduate House, cross Cumberland Ave and begin towards Elliot St.  
Stop 1: Proceed down Elliot St. to University Drive and see the Mann House  
Stop 2: Continue on University Drive to the Sommerville/Pettit Residence  
Stop 3: Venture on 12th St. and locate the Historic Corners near the Broadway Bridge  
Stop 4: Carefully cross Broadway Ave and Continue on 11th St. to the Irvine House  
Stop 5: Continue on 11th St. to the Marr Residence  
Stop 6: Backtrack up to 10th St. to pass the Gustin/Trounce Residence

Bonus: See if you can locate the following places en route to the Marr Residence while walking down University Drive: Walter Lock House, Henry Leher House, Earnest Bricker House & W.J. English House

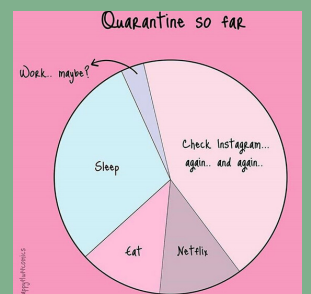
