



WHY AM I RECEIVING A FINANCIAL EVICTION NOTICE?

You are receiving an eviction notice because you have not paid your rent by the rent payment deadline were provided.

WHAT DO I DO NOW?

If you have extenuating circumstances that fall outside of typical financial issues and you have exhausted all of the supports available to you, you must meet with the Eviction Committee. Meetings are held once per month at the offices of **Protective Services** located at **72 Campus Drive.** If a resident requests to meet with the Eviction Committee, all arrangements must be made to attend the meeting on the date and time provided by the Residence Services Office, as meetings will not be arranged outside of these times. To schedule a meeting time, contact the Residence Services Office at **306-966-6775**, or email: **residence@usask.ca**.

WHAT CAN I EXPECT FROM THE EVICTION COMMITTEE MEETING?

You will meet with a team of Residence Services staff to provide them with your reasons as to why you have not paid your rent. For any of the following and other reasons – please be sure to bring ALL documentation.

- A pending external funding source (such as student loans, scholarship funds and/or band funding).
- A missed a payment that may be due to a medical condition or recent hospital stay.
- Proof of consultation with UofS campus supports and/or Financial Aid.
- Document(s) from external funding source outlining a payment that has been delayed and showing anticipated date of payment arrival.



A meeting with the committee does not guarantee that an eviction will be rescinded.
Residents should always arrive prepared with documentation and a personal/financial plan.

HOW CAN THE EVICTION COMMITTEE SUPPORT ME?

- To assist a resident who is waiting for a pending external funding source and/or medical reason for why the rent is not paid.
- To support a resident in their search for off-campus housing. However, please note that a favourable landlord reference will not be provided to residents who have received a financial eviction.
- To connect a resident with campus supports including the Student Wellness Centre for counselling provided at no cost to the student.
- To assist a resident in their upcoming transition and provide vacating instructions and guidance.

THE EVICTION COMMITTEE WILL NOT OFFER SUPPORT UNDER THE FOLLOWING CIRCUMSTANCES

- If a parent/guardian has not made your rent payment for you, or if you have no source of income at all.
- If you have used your budgeted funds (student loans etc.) on other things and cannot pay your rent.
- If you have deliberately withheld rent payments because of a maintenance issue or roommate conflict.
- If you are facing a removal from Residence for a nonfinancial matter.

HOW COULD THIS HAVE BEEN AVOIDED?

We understand that life happens and sometimes there are things that are out of your control but you need to communicate with us. If you are facing financial difficulties, contact the Residence Services Office immediately. Avoiding your financial issues will only make things more difficult in the long term. You can easily avoid additional fees like late rent fees and the Eviction Service Admin Fee by communicating and submitting a request for a monthly payment plan if needed.

Select housing based on affordability.

2

Set rent payment reminders in your calendar. This will ensure that you avoid fees or notices due to forgetfulness.

3

Create a monthly budget and keep track of your finances.

4

Request a transfer to a more affordable building before you run into financial hardship (if available).

5

Know your campus supports. A variety of supports are available to students struggling with their finances.
