CHIEF WHITECAP AND JOHN LAKE

The Founders Statue, located at the roundabout near the intersection of Spadina Crescent E and 3rd Ave S, represents the meeting between Chief Whitecap and John Lake. This meeting in 1882 lead to the founding of Saskatoon.

During the meeting, the Chief of the Whitecap Dakota First Nation told John Lake of a good place to settle about 26 km from the Whitecap community, which would become Saskatoon. The City of Saskatoon and the Whitecap community would go on to be trading partners. The statue itself was erected in 2008.

GET WALKING!

This week, our Historical Walking Tour and competition takes place in the downtown area. Don't forget a camera or a phone with a camera to take photos for the competition, and make sure you are wearing proper shoes and clothing. This tour is longer than last week's, so don't forget sun protection and a water bottle.

Start at Graduate House, and walk towards campus. Turn left on College Ave and continue until you have crossed University Bridge. Turn left onto Spadina Crescent E Stop 1: Proceed Spadina Crescent E and see Knox Church on your

right

Stop 2: Continue on Spadina Cres. E. St. Paul's Cathedral will be on your right Stop <u>3:</u> A short distance further down Spadina, you will see the

magnificent Bessborough Hotel on your left Stop 4: Continuing on, you will come to beautiful Kiwanis Park

Stop 4: Continuing on, you will come to beautiful Kiwanis Park and see the Vimy memorial Stop 5: Continue straight until you come to a small roundabout. Carefully cross the street to get a closer look at the Chief Whitecap and John Lake statue Stop 6: Turn right onto 3rd Ave S and head to about building number 269, where you will see the Yaeger Block on your left Stop 7: Continuing, you will come to 21st St E and see Hotel Senator on your left Stop 8: Turn right down 21st St. E. Turn left when you come to 4th Ave S, take a right onto 22nd S E, and a left onto 5th Ave N. Cambridge Court will be on your left a short ways down 5th Ave. To get back, turn right when you come to 23rd St E and cross University bridge again to head back home towards Residence. University bridge again to head back home towards Residence.
